We truly value our relationship with alumni and thank you for supporting your "future alumni" in the form of mini-grants to support campus activities, programs, and sports. Mini-grants enable us to continue to enhance our existing programs and increase student involvement in our school. The students and staff of your campus appreciate your strong support and advocacy!

We are THE School of Champions - Valley Champions!

I am pleased to inform you that our Boy's Soccer team has captured the Division III Valley Championship. The Warrior faithful travelled to Porterville and braved the cold to cheer on our boys as they marched into the history books by capturing the title for our beloved campus. Congratulations to Head Coach Joe Espinoza and Assistant Coaches Sarkis "Sako" Barbarian and Hugo Caballero for their work in creating our Valley Champions.

Planned Construction: The Fresno Unified School District Board of Trustees will be reviewing the preliminary plans for the construction of a new administration and library building at Fresno High School. The planned construction includes ten (10) classrooms buildings to be housed in the second story of each building providing our campus with the ability to eliminate portable classroom buildings. In addition, upon completion of the new construction the current administration and library buildings will be demolished and provide an unobstructed view of Royce Hall. We are working with the professional firm of TAM CZ Architects who have gone over and above to learn about Fresno High School's history and bright future. The funding for the planned construction will involve the use of Measure Q Bond and Overcrowding Relief Grant (ORG) resources pending FUSD approval of the preliminary plans with work starting as soon as Fall 2011.

Naming Process for the Fresno High School Pool: The Fresno Unified School District created an online recommendation process for the public to provide input on the naming of the pool on our campus. The online portal closed on March 4th, 2011 with all recommendations currently being assembled and prepared for review by the Fresno High School Site Council. The council is comprised of parents, teachers, school staff, and students who have been elected to represent each of the groups. Upon the completion of the review process all viable recommendations will be forwarded to the Fresno Unified School District Board of Trustees for final approval. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding throughout this process.

I am looking forward to the All-Alumni Dinner on Saturday, May 7, 2011 to thank you in person for all that you do for Fresno High School. We will continue to make a difference for the students of Fresno High School because of alumni like you.

Winning Warriors

There was a time, many moons ago--many many moons, all Warrior athletic programs displayed dominance in competition, across the board. By the mid-eighties winning programs were sporadic or non-existent at the school. The year of 1987, my junior year at Fresno High, was one of those years where we still had a breath of competition in our athletic programs, and a reminisce of decades past. Jerry Urzua had won the Valley Championship as a member of a talented wrestling team. Jerry was the first wrestling Champion at the school in close to a decade, and the last the school has known. Our baseball team, led by a future Major League pitcher named Bobby Jones, beat a favored Redwood High team on

their home turf in Visalia. Several from the team went on to compete collegiately in the sport, and Bobby pitched in a World Series, and is the last Warrior to appear in *The Show*.

For me, as a water polo player, it was the year we beat Clovis West, something never done before or since, and we did it in their pool. Fresno's polo team had lost our Blue Chip athlete the year before, the only All American in program history, Julian Bailey. He went on to win three National Championships at Cal Berkeley, along with another All American award. Our FHS team in 1987 was not expected to be the same caliber as the '86 team. In '86 we appeared in a competitive Valley Playoff tournament, placing a respected 4th, which is the highest placement in program history. However the '87 team was led by a talented Senior named Wes Threlkeld, and we captured victories against Clovis and Bullard. The team also included Kristin Clague, our sole female teammate, as girls water polo was nonexistent.

We went on to beat The Golden Eagles by 2, and put the West crowd of 300-plus supporters into a state of shock, a Victory that still lies fresh in the Clovis West's coach's mind today. Wes and I went on to play polo for the nationally ranked Fresno State Bulldogs, Kristen went on to swim for Yale, and three others on the team continued on at area Junior Colleges.

Truth be told, I don't know if there was magic in any of the named teams, and athletes of 1987. I think we all just had a pride about ourselves. We were willing to work hard, and had strong support within our programs. In short, we had heart. The important thing to remember as alum of Fresno High is even today, our athletic teams, who may not have winning traditions, are filled with young athletes with this same heart. However, if these student-athletes

are not given all the support needed to foster winning habits, the school's athletic squads will perform in sub-par fashion. We need to take an interest in performance and make sure those who represent FHS are given everything needed to do so properly. As a pride arises in athletics, so will it within the school—and as we wake the echoes of voices past, we can take a step forward and once again taste victory within the School of Champions.

Fresno High was born on the third floor of Emerson elementary on K Street located in downtown Fresno 122 years ago. Due to construction problems in the first few weeks, the 50 students and three teachers were moved to the First Congregational Church until a permanent school was built in 1896.

students with the past and to help define the future of so many who attend today. Besides the \$10,000 to \$15,000 we give to the students through grant requests occurring throughout the school year, there are other areas in which we enrich the alumni of FHS.

Each of the past four years, during the inducting of several past athletes into the Fresno High Wall of Champions, we support at least 50 current students to enjoy the evening and connect with the past athletes in their fields of endeavor. This is generally at a cost of about \$1,300 each year.

We also support Fresno High reunions that are organized each year. Besides the support of "What do we do, how do we start, where do we go," we offer our services at each reunion when needed. We will sit at registration tables so the class hosts can enjoy the evening with their classmates.

Terry sat in front of me in Miss Palmer's English class, I wonder if he remembers me? Miss Palmer made us memorize a poem and recite it in class. UGH! But I still remember that poem. Today I like to read poetry and even attempted to write a poem or two over the years. Miss Palmer reminded us day after day ... "today I'm teaching, and therefore, you are learning". I remember being in a teaching situation as an adult and using those very words. Yes, Miss Palmer was teaching and I, perhaps inadvertently, was learning, building a foundation for what would become life-long pleasures.

Mrs. Miller showed me how to see the humor in life and laugh at myself. In class, she told us a very funny story of putting her girdle in the dryer to speed the drying process, and the heat melted the garter gismos that held her stockings up and by mid-first period, she noticed her stockings sagging and creeping down and the little rubber spots on the floor under her desk. self-importance are gone and we come to this time in our lives, bare faced, comfortable with who we have become, recognizing we are 'gently aging WARRIORS', but still WARRIORS bound together by our common and uncommon experiences at FHS.

My prayer is that as individuals and as a class, we are still 'full of IT' and more. The IT being wisdom, health, and riches in things that matter, and more compassionate, more generous, and more thoughtful. We are BETTER WARRIORS, than we were that night in 1961. Therefore with pride we can still wrap our arms around each other and with attitude befitting a 50th anniversary, we sing in one voice ... **HAIL TO FRESNO HIGH** ... Ten More Inducted into FHS Athletic Wall of Champions

Ten more ex-Warrior athletic greats were inducted into the Fresno High Athletic Wall of Champions on the 6th of October at Pardini's. Over 210 people attended, including 44 present Fresno High student-athletes.

Fresno TV personality, and FHS alumnus, Kopi Sotiropulos was the master of ceremonies. Alumni chairman Jack Fowler introduced the new Fresno High principal Adrian Palazuelos to the gathering who confirmed his commitment to the work of the Fresno High Alumni and the continued spirit of the "Warrior Nation".

Ted Wills, Jr., (1951) was FHS pitcher who played for Pete Beiden at Fresno State and 6 years of Major League Baseball with the Boston Red Sox.

Mike Noakes, (1957) played varsity baseball and basketball at Fresno High. After graduating from Cal Berkeley he became the most successful high school baseball coach in valley history.

Toby Lawless, (1936) was an all around athlete at Fresno High and Fresno State in the mid 30's playing both basketball and football and returned to Fresno High as a coach.

John Alstrom, (1960) was a 3 year starter on the FHS basketball team and was on the US Volleyball Team at the 1968 Olympics at Mexico City.

Rene Polanco, (1982) was an early pioneer in the rise of women's softball. Rene went on from Fresno High to be standout player for Fresno State.

Erwin Ginsburg, (Coach From 1929 -1955) coached many sports at Fresno High and helped the school live up to its "School of Champions" tradition.

Jack Erdman, (1966) was an all around football, basketball and track athlete at FHS and Fresno State and had a successful coaching and teaching career at Clovis High.

John Hoover, (1980) was a Warrior baseball pitcher who went on to become an All-American at Fresno State and played for the US National team.

Walt Byrd, (1931) was one of Fresno High's earliest exceptionally talented athletes who went on to star at Fresno State and eventually coached against Fresno High for cross-town rival Roosevelt High.

Anthony Washington, (1976) was a football and track standout at Fresno High, played college football for both Cal and Fresno State and had a pro football career with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Washington Redskins.



Les Richter

On the eve of Super Bowl XLV, Les Richter (class of 1948) was elected into the National Football League Hall of Fame. Richter, who died last June at the age of 79, played nine years as a linebacker with the Los Angeles Rams.



After his outstanding football career at Fresno High, he went on to gridiron success as an integral part of Pappy Waldorf's California Golden Bear's teams that won three conference championships and played in three consecutive Rose Bowls.

In 1952, Richter was selected as the number one pick of the now defunct New York Yankees, who became the Dallas Texans. Because Dallas needed players, Richter was dealt to the Rams for 11 players.

In nine seasons with the Rams, Richter played the linebacker position with intensity and determination. He played in 112 games, a Rams record, despite suffering multiple injuries throughout his career. Richter will be inducted into the Football Hall of Fame on August 6, 2011 in Canton, Ohio.

After football, he distinguished himself in auto racing by serving

as president of the Riverside International Raceway for 21 years
